

Reference	3143	Activity Description	Re-opening and operation of schools following relaxation of coronavirus restrictions.  The COVID-19 Advisory Sub-Group on Education and Children's Issues has published scientific advice on physical distancing in schools. The advice states: "Subject to continued suppression of the virus, and to surveillance and mitigations being in place, the balance of the evidence suggests that no distancing should be required between children in primary schools. The evidence is less clear for older pupils but at present we support the same approach being taken in secondary schools on the basis of the balance of known risks, the effectiveness of mitigations and the benefits to young people of being able to attend school."
