Entry Level: What do I need to do it?

You need to have already shown a commitment and a willingness to learn and to practise, both in class and at home.

Your entry level should be A or high B at National 5 in German.

Course Content: What will I learn?



You will continue to develop the four skills of Talking, Listening, Reading and Writing. We work on the themes of Society & Culture and Learning & Employablity. You will also develop a greater understanding of the mechanics of English language as well as furthering your knowledge of German grammar.

Teaching Methods: What will I do?

You will work in a variety of ways including pair work, group discussion, problem solving and individual tasks, to enhance and develop further your foreign language skills. Activities include films, presentations and working to understand more complex varied texts. Discussion of current events in Germany and other German speaking countries is also a very important priority.

Assessment: How will I be assessed?

All four skills of Reading, Listening, Talking and Writing are assessed. In addition, an external exam assesses Reading, Writing and Listening.

Homework.

You will already be used to the variety of home study activities set in Modern Languages: vocabulary revision, skills practice and preparation for assessments. It is vital that you organise your learning to get the most out of your foreign language experience.
