listen to instructions


put their hand up if they need help

Social Subjects – How to Support Your Child's Learning

- Talk to them and encourage them to read about current events and news items such as political events, natural disasters, world conflicts, remembrance events and places of interest in the UK and the World. Newsround and the Week Junior are really good resources for this
- Encourage them to read about these topics in whatever way they wish
- Look at Showbie staff will be adding pieces to your child's portfolio throughout their units of work. At the end of each unit, pupils will get a chance to reflect on their learning and revision. This task will be put on Showbie and shared with parents.
